Art Design Specs

Size: No bigger than 1500mm x 2150mm

Medium: We will accept a variety of mediums including, but not limited to, fabric, oil, watercolour, and wood. The piece needs to be able to hang on the wall and be removable. We will not accept concepts for artwork that need to be painted/applied directly on the wall. Covenant House Vancouver will not supply materials.

Timeline

Stage One—Submission Period

- Submissions can be sent by email to expansion@covenanthousebc.org, or in person at our 1302 Seymour St. location; Attn: Adel Cotichini.
- Submissions should include your name, email, and phone number, along with at least three (3) examples of your previous work. Portfolios or links to the artist's website are acceptable.
- The deadline for submissions is December 6.
- The three artists chosen to continue to Stage Two will be notified by email, in early January.

Stage Two-Concept Delivery Period

 Art concepts to be received by the Covenant House Vancouver Art Committee (February).

Stage Three

- Final artist and concept chosen. All three finalists will be notified by email or phone (early March).
- Artist agreement signed with deadline set for delivery of piece.
- Final piece received by Covenant House Vancouver (mid-April).

Commission will be paid 40% at time of final artist selection, with remaining 60% paid upon completion and delivery. Art will be owned by Covenant House Vancouver and will remain on displayed in our 1280 Seymour St. location, for a duration of time, as determined by Covenant House.
