

Indigenous Youth Homelessness

At Covenant House Vancouver and Beyond

Across BC¹

While only 6% of BC's total population are Indigenous (according to the 2016 Census), about 39% of people experiencing homelessness self-identify as Indigenous.

Indigenous individuals continue to experience homelessness at a massively disproportionate rate.

Of these Indigenous people experiencing homelessness, approximately:


INDIGENOUS YOUTH STAYED IN OUR CRISIS PROGRAM
